The motorcade was greeted by groups of country folk along the way and the tenor of some of the travellers in the procession was the "Money Come". Dr. Jagan, unlike on a previous occasion, did not make his usual and accustomed fiery, street corner speech on the results of his mission, and the motorcade wended its way for the Minister's home in Queenstown after passing the P.P.P. headquarters in Wellington Street.

And so while the city was going to bed last night, the man whose actions and words will be eagerly awaited had returned home with a brief case full of news and hopes for the people of British Guiana.

## Mile-Long Motorcade Cheered on Way to City

**Newsman Baulked: P.P.P. Mum on Mission**

**P.P.P. supporters and sympathisers turned out en masse last night to come home their "Freedom Fighter" as placard read from his money mission to United Kingdom. But Dr. Jagan had not new to add to his reaction to the success failure of his mission and even disappointed his supporters in waiving his usual post arrival account of his stewardship abroad.**

As the forward lights of the B.W.I.A. plane bringing Dr. Jagan appeared in the darkness and the aircraft, touched down on the Atkinson runway, the crowd with banners and placards aloft shouted cheers of welcome which resounded throughout the remains and make shift accommodation of the Atkinson terminal building.

The crowd which was by this time all worked up with anxiety to see their leader were becoming restless and as the aircraft taxied along the runway the cheers became louder and the crowd more restless.

### LIFTED ON HIGH

The appearance of the P.P.P. boss in a well-tailored fawn suit with a flowing light-grey polka-dot tie brought roars from supporters who were cordoned off from going on to the runway. On hand to greet their leader were all the Ministers of the Government with pleasing smiles which were matched by the usual winning smile of Dr. Jagan.

The crowd were only waiting to get hold of the P.P.P. boss and as he made his way to the airport building or what is left of it, he was suddenly lifted on to the shoulders of a wild and disorderly crowd who were bent on bearing their burden if possible down to Georgetown.

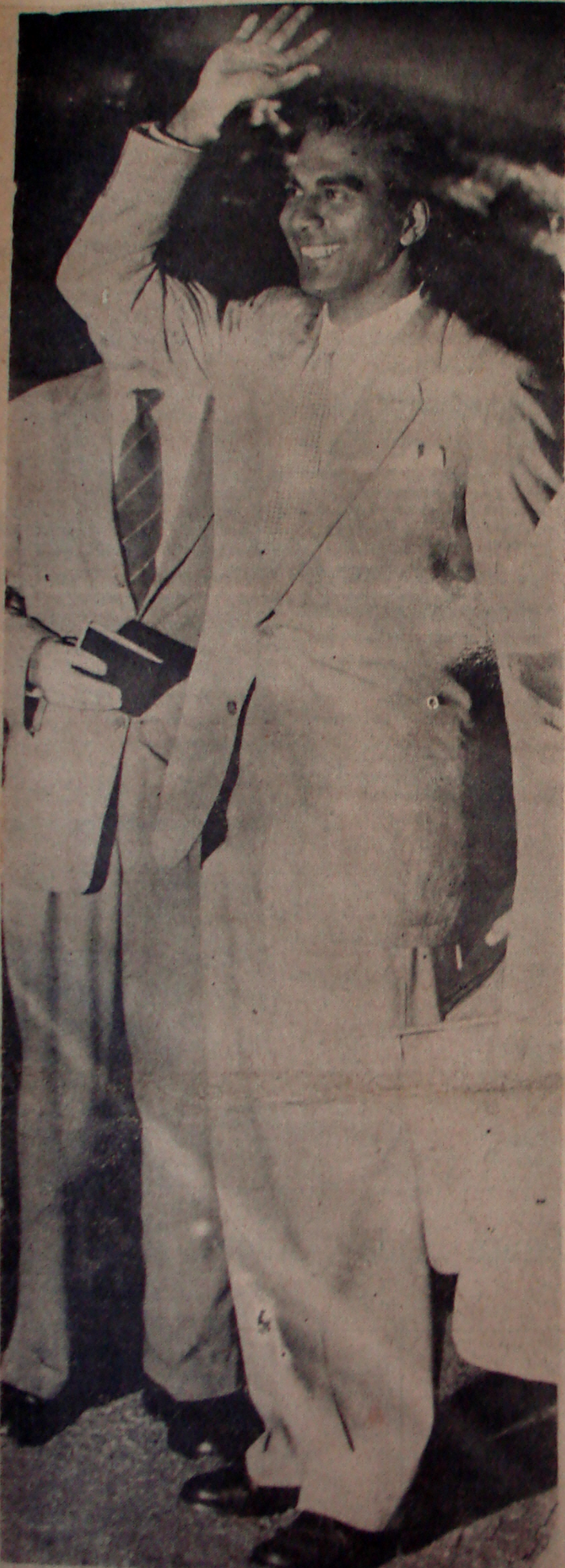
Dr. Jagan wore his broad smile still looking pleased with himself and the welcome, but the behaviour of the welcomers would have made even Job lose his patience. They refused to put the P.P.P. boss on terra firma even against his wish and that of other Party bigwigs.

MINISTER GARLANDED  
Everyone wanted to get near the doctor and there was evidently not sufficient of Dr. Jagan to go around. Even some Government Ministers were forced to raise their voices and in one instance a Minister had to use sheer physical strength to prevent supporters from pulling the P.P.P. boss apart.

The means of transportation for Dr. Jagan was another cause for shouting and disagreement, the big question being should the "Doc" travel by truck or by car. Finally the truck supporters won out, and Dr. Jagan was lifted bodily into the vehicle which started the nearly mile long motorcade for the city, not before Miss Lorna Hasanali after several efforts of getting near Dr. Jagan could galland the ever-smiling Minister.

Newsmen were pushed from side to side in their efforts to get in a few questions with the Minister of Trade and Industry who had returned home after clinching a one hundred and ten million dollar loan for British Guiana from the U.K.
