Although the four leading parties contested the elections there was general agreement in their broad aims to defend the revolution and preserve freedom of the press and democratic liberties.

The present Government is a coalition government of three main parties—the AD, URD, and Copel. The Communist Party which holds the smallest number of seats in the National Assembly is out of the Government.
