As regards my dental practise, I work only for 1% hours a day relieving my brother during his lunch break. And this in no way is allowed to interfere with my visits overseas and my frequent visits to the countryside, sometimes for many days at a time.

I'm sure your remarks about my association with GDMPEX does not bother the public. As a shareholders, including myself, of thus business have not, and do not intend, to receive dividends from profits, if any, as in other business enterprises.
