
The Price of Love: Cheddi Jagan

The documentary, crafted by Richard Audley Vaughn, delves into the life, work, and political career of Guyana's third executive President, Dr. Cheddi Jagan. It was launched at the Cheddi Jagan Research Centre in Georgetown, Guyana on March 22, 2024 to mark the 106th birth anniversary of Cheddi Jagan. The documentary "The Price of Love" serves as a poignant reminder of Dr. Cheddi Jagan's enduring legacy and his profound impact on Guyana's history.

Cheddi Jagan was the first Marxist democratically elected leader elected in the Western Hemisphere 1953.

Born in rural Guyana, educated at Howard and Northwestern Universities in the United States where he would meet his wife, Janet. Returning to Guyana they would dedicate their lives to the upliftment of the Guyanese people.

After winning the first elections in 1953 held under universal adult suffrage, Cheddi and his Progressive Peoples Party would see their government suspended by a British coup after 133 days.

Bitter divisions, Cold War Politics, racial violence, CIA plots all conspired to bring down one man's fight for the freedom of his people.

The Price of Love: Cheddi Jagan features interviews from his children, Joey and Nadira, Sister Babara, political rival Hamilton Green and many comrades who knew him well tell his story alongside archival footage featuring Cheddi, Janet Jagan and Forbes Burnham.

The Price of Love: Cheddi Jagan tells the story of a leader who throughout his life put his people first and paid a price for his love.

The Price of Love: Cheddi Jagan is the third film in a trilogy of films that includes "The Word is Love: Jamaica's Michael Manley" (2012) and "Four Years of Love: The Grenada Revolution (2021).
