JANET SAYS:

Caribbean Council Only Vehicle for Friendship

Mrs. Janet Jagan, told delegates at the inaugural meeting of the Caribbean Council that "this Organisation is the only vehicle for bringing the several territories of the Caribbean together to exchange friendships, knowledge and experience."

Mrs. Jagan, who along with Mr. D. P. D'Andrade, represented the country at the meeting which took place in San Juan, Puerto Rico, added that "no longer can we live in isolation from one another divided by language and cultural difference. Of necessity, we must draw closer together and join our efforts to make our Caribbean community a better place to live in."

Following is Mrs. Jagan's address.

"As the delegate from British Guiana it gives me great pleasure to be here at the inauguration of the new Caribbean Organization. For us it comes at a most significant moment. For today, in British Guiana, a new Government is being formed, under the first self-governing constitution in our long history as a Colony. There is now left for British Guiana only the final step to independent status, which we predict will follow shortly.

"Thus, the change-over from the Caribbean Commission to the Caribbean Organization, with all that it implies, on this day, is doubly significant to us and fills our hearts with joy.


