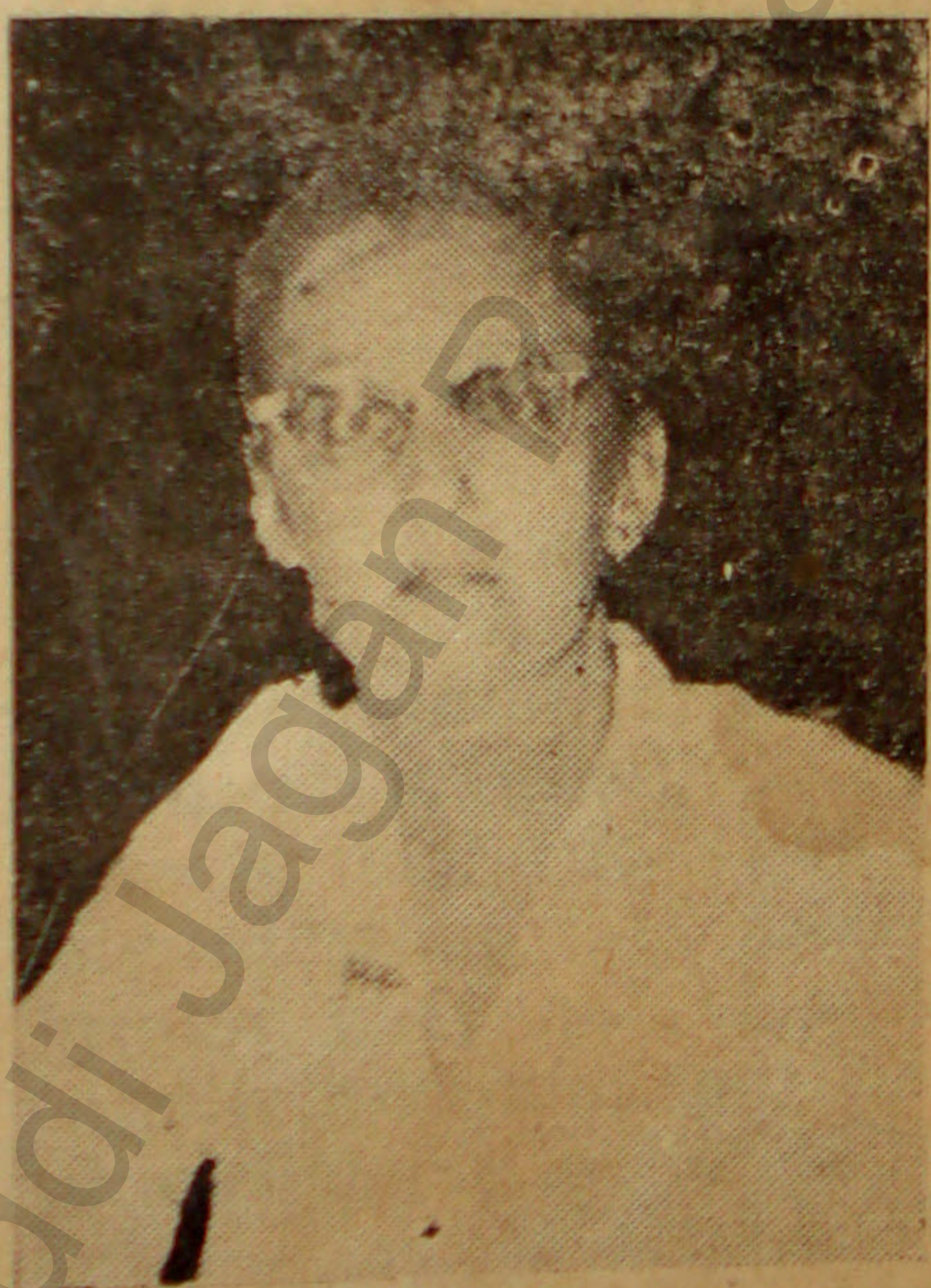

# Janet Addresses Peace Council In Sweden

**S**PEAKING before the national Independence Commission of the world Peace Council held this month in Stockholm, Sweden, Mrs. Janet Jagan, General Secretary of the P.P.P. said:—

"I represent a mass movement which is involved in this struggle for national independence. British Guiana is seeking to become politically independent so that it can then proceed to establish its economic independence. It is a potentially rich country with vast resources in land, minerals, forest, unharnessed water resources, which have all been neglected by years of colonial rule.
